| 5. | Description of policy to be screened | <p>The Council in conjunction with key community influencers, after independent mediation, has agreed to erect a number of cultural banners as an alternative to the flying of illegal flags in the Holywood area.</p> <p>The banners display images, reflecting cultural heritage in Northern Ireland.</p> <p>The banners are to be erected along part of the route through Holywood town centre for the Ards and North Down District parade on 12 July 2015. (Please see attached a map showing the lampposts that the banners will be erected from).</p> |
| | Aims and Expected Outcomes – what is the Policy expected to achieve? | <p>To reduce community tension by reducing the number of illegal flags flown in the area. Therefore starting the process to create a more inclusive and shared space for all users. The area identified is leading to and from the town centre. The displayed banners will be in place in the period leading up to and following the twelfth July 2015 parade.</p> <p>To create an area as the start of an ongoing process, that is perceived to be less intimidating and more inclusive.</p> |
