## Refusal Reasons for LA06/2025/0376/F

- 1. The proposal is contrary to the Strategic Planning Policy Statement for Northern Ireland (2015) and Policy BH 14 of Planning Policy Statement 6: Archaeology and Built Heritage, in that the demolition of the front boundary wall does not make a positive contribution to the Holywood Conservation Area.
- 2. The proposal is contrary to the Strategic Planning Policy Statement for Northern Ireland (2015) and Policy BH 12 of Planning Policy Statement 6: Archaeology and Built Heritage, in that the replacement of the front garden with a hard surfaced parking area detracts from the overall character of the Holywood Conservation Area.

## Refusal Reason for LA06/2025/0486/A

1. The proposal is contrary to the Strategic Planning Policy Statement for Northern Ireland and Policy AD 1 of Planning Policy Statement 17: Control of Outdoor Advertisements, in that it does not respect amenity in the context of the general characteristics of the locality.
