I am a local resident, I live within walking distance to the playing fields and groomspport. I wish to oppose the development of this stite, it is such a privilege to have any open wild space. I would be very sad to see the greenbelt destroyed.

There have seen many starlings here making regular use of this habitat, along with many other birds. I have seen Irish Hare in spring in the nearby field. along the hedgerows one evening I saw what I believe was a pine marten. There are animal borrows here as well, I am unsure what animal, but have seen the burrows.

While this site has been left, people have used it for walking, children playing, I have seen people flying drones or RC cars. There is no heavy traffic, occasional cars but you can mostly see it is used and appreciated by people within walking distance.

Even though it is close to the house the greenbelt is enough here that on a clearer night you can see the stars as it is an area with no or minimal light pollution.

I am asking the council to please try to save the greenbelt and this space from development.
