

## Aerial View – Bangor Marina

Bangor Marina's pontoons are clearly identified by coloured pile caps to aid navigation and orientation, with Pontoon A marked in black, B in yellow, C in brown, D in pink, E in dark blue, F in red, G in green, H in white, and I in orange.

All pontoons are fitted with both fixed and portable ladders to ensure safe access and rapid egress in the event of an emergency; fixed ladders are clearly marked with either a flag or appropriate signage on the pontoon piles.

Fire extinguishers and lifebuoys are securely housed within designated Emergency Boxes, which are strategically positioned at the beginning, midpoint, and end of each pontoon walkway to allow for quick and effective response.

In the event of an emergency, individuals should first ensure their own safety, raise the alarm immediately, and contact the appropriate emergency service by dialling 999.

Request the Fire Brigade in the case of fire, an Ambulance for medical emergencies, and the Police when reporting a crime in progress or where there is an immediate risk to life. The Coastguard should be contacted whenever there is a risk to life or potential danger to individuals, whether on board a vessel or ashore.

When calling, clearly state the location as Bangor Marina, County Down, to assist emergency responders in reaching the scene without delay.
